



Track Days - FAQs

What are the Track Days allocated for 2011?

Track School's Ultimate Track Days fall on either a Wednesday or Thursday, once a month. Check out the list of available dates on the Track Days web page.

Do I need to be an experienced track driver?

No, track days cater for all levels of driving ability from novices to experienced race drivers.

Will I have an experienced driver with me on the day?

Track School always has experienced racing car drivers to provide instruction on the Track Days. Depending on your level of driving ability instruction may cover anything from acceleration/braking and racing lines to specific driving or handling problems you may be having.

Do I know which instructor I will have?

It is not possible to guarantee particular driving instructors for particular Track Days as some driving instructors may have other commitments.

How do I book my Track Day?

Go to the Book Now button on the Track Days web page and fill in the email form or telephone John Boston 0412 574 010 and leave your details.

How long will I have on the track?

We aim to give each driver a 15 minute session each hour. Drivers are divided into a maximum of four groups.

What criteria are used to divide drivers into groups?

At registration, drivers will be assessed as to their competency for different grades of speed and their driving experience. After the morning briefing, drivers of a certain competency and experience will find themselves in groups with other drivers of a similar standard.

What is a second driver?

Second drivers share the same car within the same group as the primary driver. The idea is that the second driver may utilize some of your track time within your group. Second drivers may not move to another group.



How many cars are allowed on the track at any one time?

At Wakefield Park the upper limit is set at 15. This number allows cars to travel in safety at considerable speed.

Do I need a helmet?

You are required to wear an approved helmet which can be hired at the track.

Do I need a licence?

To drive at Wakefield Park you will need a Wakefield Clubcomp Licence. A day license costs \$25 or you can choose to pay \$50 on an annual basis.

Do I need insurance in case of an accident?

If you wish to take out special insurance for the Track Day some insurers offer this. If you have an accident, neither Track School nor Wakefield Park Raceway will be liable. You will need to sort matters out directly with the driver of the other vehicle.

What condition does my vehicle have to be in?

As a general rule, your car needs to be roadworthy. It is a good idea to have your car serviced, fluids topped up and brake pads in good order prior to a Track Day. Depending upon the condition of your vehicle, some basic tools and engine oil may come in handy.

What condition do my tyres need to be in?

Road tyres are good but high performance or semi slick tyres are better at giving you control of your vehicle.

What if the weather is bad?

The idea of the Track Day is to work with the condition of the track and to develop relevant skills. The track will not close unless the weather is extreme or excess water run-off is not possible.

Can I bring a passenger?

Passengers are only permitted if the driver is under instruction from a Track School driving instructor or a Track School driving instructor is sitting in the front passenger seat. Passengers are not permitted during timed sessions.

What if I can't make it on the day?

Your Track School ticket is non-refundable. Once full and final payment is received you have a guaranteed place on the Track Day.
